WHAT IS NALOXONE?

Naloxone is commonly called Narcan. Naloxone is a medication that may stop an opioid overdose, including those caused by fentanyl. Naloxone is a legal medication that restores a person's normal breathing if it has slowed or stopped due to an opioid overdose. Naloxone has no effect on someone who does not have opioids in their system.

GOOD SAMARITAN LAW (WA)

“If you seek medical assistance in a drug-related overdose, you cannot be prosecuted for drug possession. The overdose victim is also protected from drug possession charges. Anyone in WA State who might have or witness an opioid overdose is allowed to carry and administer naloxone.”
